Introduction

This summary has been produced from the Western Australian Government Gazettes, which were available as scanned documents online at the website of the State Law Publisher in Western Australia, part of the Department of Premier and Cabinet. This was referred to in the initial volume of this series, covering the years 1858 to 1904.

However since 1st April 2021, the WA Government Gazettes have only been published on the website of the Parliamentary Counsel's Office, Department of Justice, Government of Western Australia. They can be found at the following addresses:

As it always possible that arrangements may change again, be aware that it should be possible to find via links in Trove.

An attempt has been made to include all entries in the Government Gazette that are relevant to Railways and Tramways, both government and private. As well, entries have been included that appear to have some interaction with railways and tramways, or give some additional relevance to the environment in which those systems were operating.

All available Gazettes within each year have been checked in producing this summary; this includes the main Gazettes, the Supplements and the Extraordinary editions. Experience has shown that important information can be 'tucked' in at the tail end of what appeared to be an edition of statistical data only. Please note that Indexes are available for later years; these are generally of assistance, but they are not always complete, nor do the index entries reveal the minute details that appear in some entries.

Coverage

This current volume covers the years 1905 to 1925, following on from the first volume that covered the years 1858 to 1904.

I am attempting to continue the summary process, but it will take some time; each year can consist of 2,000 to 4,500 pages, and the items are not always logically placed!

Notes on Entries

All of the entries in this volume have an associated reference in parentheses. These are in two forms. **(page nnn)** indicates that the entry in the summary can be found at that page in that year's Gazettes, and that the entry in the summary is essentially the full entry in the Gazette, with only

'noise' phrases such as 'lowest or any tender not necessarily accepted' excluded. **(detail page nnn)** indicates that the entry is the first part of the whole item, and that it was too long to include in full. The full items can be found online by going to the website, the detail listings within the year/month give the starting page of each Gazette.

Some items are very long (over 200 pages for a published Classification and Rates book); I have separately extracted some of these, and the published timetables. I can make these available to you via email if you wish (see email address below).

Please note that not everything was always reported in the Government Gazette. You will find examples within here of Tenders being called without any subsequent notice of the acceptance of the Tender. Similarly there are some Accepted Tenders where there is no trace in the Gazette of a Tender having been called. Tenders for some items (locomotives, some rolling stock, rail etc) were quite often arranged through the Agent-General in London, and no local Tenders were called.

In some cases there may also have been mistakes in paperwork not being sent for publication, or being delayed internally. In one case the Completion Certificate for the Great Southern Railway was published over 17 months late in the Gazette, with an accompanying note that it 'should have been published some time ago'.

Acknowledgements

I would like to thank relevant Government Offices for their efforts in making these Documents available online; they are a great boon to researchers in many fields, not just railway history.

I would also like to acknowledge the assistance and encouragement of Jeff Austin, whose enthusiasm when I found some of the early entries in the Gazettes encouraged me to attempt to fully cover this area.

Usage of this Document

I make this document freely available to enable researchers of railway and tramway history to have easy access to the information contained herein.

You are quite free to pass on this document to other people who would find the information helpful. I would ask that in doing so, you do maintain my name on the document as the original compiler, and do not change the contents.
